Hosea 10:12

"Fertile Ground"

Intro.

- I. **Luke 1:35** Mary was *overshadowed* (to invest with supernatural influence) by the power of the Highest.
 - A. She was pure physically and spiritually, resulting in God's favor (divine grace) & a high standing with God.
 - B. Because of this, she was prepared to be used by God for His glory, even the miraculous birth of His Son, Jesus Christ. <u>God saw her as a worthy investment of His supernatural influence to be poured into.</u>
 - 1) Are we in a right standing with God that would draw His favor & desire to invest in our lives, whether for the miraculous or the mundane?
 - 2) <u>How</u> does this happen? <u>How do we ensure we are fertile ground</u> for God?
 - a) Plant God's standards.
 - b) Harvest God's crops.
 - c) Plow our hardened heart.
 - d) Pursue the Lord.
 - e) Patiently await God's prompting.

Body

- I. Hosea 10:12 Fertile ground for God.
 - A. Plant God's standards: V.12 "Sow for yourselves righteousness"
 - 1) Sow (Heb.) = to plant; to scatter seed

- 2) Righteousness (Heb.) = legal <u>and</u> relational; static <u>and</u> dynamic what is right & just **in God's eyes**; embodying all that God expects of His people.
 - a) Many sow everything but righteousness in their lives & then wonder why God's blessings are absent from their life -v.1-2.
 - b) You <u>reap</u> (Gr = gather; receive) what you sow, **regardless of** intent or interpretations—Gal. 6:7-8; Is. 3:10-11; Luke 6:38.
- 3) For yourselves = nobody else can do it for you.
 - a) If you want to reap God's blessings in your life, don't be dependent on someone else to invoke it = live faithfully to Him. God wants <u>your</u> faithfulness.
 - i) Ex. 8:8, 28; 9:28 Pharaoh to Moses, to stop the plagues.
 - ii) Num. 21:7 Israel to Moses to remove the serpents.
 - iii) 1 Sam. 7:8; 12:19 Israel to Samuel to stop God's wrath.
 - iv) Jer. 37:3; 42:2, 20 Leaders to Jeremiah for intercession & mercy.
 - v) Acts 18:24 Simon the sorcerer to Peter for forgiveness of his sins.

B. Harvest God's crops: V.12 – "Reap in mercy"

- 1) Results of sowing righteousness: when we do what is right *in God's eyes*, we invoke His mercies & blessings!
 - a) Ps. 106:3; Prov. 11:18; Is. 32:17; Gal. 6:7-9; James 3:18

C. Plow our hardened heart: V.12 – "Break up your fallow ground."

- 1) Break up = to till or plow
- 2) <u>Your</u> fallow ground = stop focusing on the changes everyone else needs to make and plow the fields of your own heart Deut. 4:9; 1 Tim. 4:16

- 3) Fallow = untilled; hardened
 - a) Jer. 4:3-4; Deut. 10:16; Matt. 13:1-9; Rom. 2:28-29
 - b) How do we break up the fallow ground of our heart?
 - i) Stop debating God's word; accept it for what it says James 1:21-25.
 - ii) Stop defending sinful behavior: acknowledge it for what it is Ps. 32:5; 51:1-4; 1 John 1:9.
 - iii) Stop deflecting God's conviction: submit & repent.
- D. Pursue the Lord: V.12 "For it is time to seek the Lord" Rom. 13:11-14
 - 1) Israel had been seeking everything else; they had progressively fallen away from God & into spiritual adultery with the idols of the surrounding nations James 1:12-16.
 - 2) When we drift away from God, our hearts become hardened. When our hearts are hardened, we do not, cannot & will not seek God – Is. 59:1-2; Ezekiel 3:7; Acts 7:51; Rom. 8:5-8
 - 3) What did you seek after most in 2020? Will 2021 be a repeat?
- E. Patiently await God's prompting: v.12 "Till He comes and rains righteousness on you."
 - 1) A farmer doesn't wait until the threat of rain to start planting crops, preparing the soil, etc.; he does it ahead of time. Even in the midst of drought, he ensures everything is ready to receive the nourishment it so desperately needs to grow.
 - 2) So it is spiritually: we can't wait to prepare our hearts for God's rains of blessing & nourishment; if we do it'll be too late; we'll miss out & like crops, will dry up & wither away.
 - 3) Even when we're not seeing the expected promise of God's blessing & nurturing, we know He is faithful & will give us what we need,

but we cannot wait; we have to prepare our hearts ahead of time = we have to be ready to receive God's word, message, plan, purpose, direction...just like Mary, so that when it arrives, we'll readily accept it:

a) Luke 1:38 – "Behold the maidservant of the Lord! Let it be to me according to your word."
