#### "The True Vine"

#### Intro.

- I. 3 vines of Scripture
  - A. Past vine = Israel Is. 5:1-7; Jer. 2:21; Ezekiel 15; Hos. 10:1
  - B. Future vine = vine of the earth Rev. 14:14-20
  - C. Present & permanent Vine = Jesus Christ Himself

### **Body**

- I. Jesus; The True Vine
  - A. V.1 "I AM" the <u>true</u> vine and My Father is the vinedresser.
    - 1) *I Am the true vine = there are false vines*.
      - a) False vines of truth; joy; strength, hope; purpose; Christianity.
        - There are a lot of "vines" people attach themselves to, thinking they give the life they need, when in reality, they're actually draining them. Some "vines" are flat out poisonous 2 Cor. 11:14; 1 John 4:1; 2 Pet. 2:1-3, 18-22.
    - 2) My Father is the vinedresser
      - a) Vinedresser (Gr.) = land worker; farmer
      - b) Responsibilities = planting; watering; harvesting; *pruning* 
        - i) God is the perfect vinedresser who knows exactly what we need to produce more fruit for His glory.
  - B. V.2 The purpose of the branch
    - 1) "Every branch in Me that does not bear fruit He takes away..."

- a) "In Me" = a genuine Christian Matt. 15:13 (Ezekiel 17:9) = God "uproots" those not really His; He weeds out & winnows His fields (Judas John 13:10).
  - i) Real Christians bear fruit for/of Christ Matt. 3:8; 7:15-20; 13:18-23; Gal. 5:22-24
- b) "He takes away" = any branch that doesn't bear fruit is dead & useless. If you plant a fruit tree you're expecting a return Is. 5:1-4; Matt. 3:10.
- 2) "...and every branch that bears fruit He prunes, that it may bear more fruit." (The purpose of the fruit is to feed others!)
  - a) <u>Every</u> branch = If we're not being pruned then we're not bearing fruit; <u>if we're not bearing fruit</u>...???
  - b) Prunes (Gr.) = to cleanse from filthy impurity
    - i) Pruning involves cutting off overgrowth & dead limbs to allow room for new growth & fruit.
    - ii) While potentially painful, it's vitally necessary & how does God prune us? >v.3 "...the word..." 2 Tim. 3:16; Heb. 4:12
      - 1) Many Christians want to be more fruitful for God without the pruning process.
      - 2) God will always prune the Christian's life of filthy impurities in order to produce more fruit for Him.
      - 3) May not always be sinful, but simply God getting us ready for what's next 1 Pet. 4:12-13.
      - 4) And it takes time for the new sprouts of growth to become visible!!!
  - c) "More fruit" (6x's in v.1-8; also in v.16)

- i) One harvest isn't enough; God not only wants us to produce fruit for Him, He wants us to produce **more** fruit. (Progression: no fruit; fruit & **more** fruit v.2; **much** fruit v.5,8) = we never reach a point in our life where we "retire" from His work!
- ii) We're never too old; never done enough; never time to relax Acts 17: Paul > Thessalonica, Berea, Athens.

- A. Acts of sinless behavior Is. 5:7(Justice & righteousness); Eph. 4:1-3
- B. Acts of service:
  - 1) *Witnessing* Matt. 5:16; 9:37-38; 28:19-20; Rom. 1:13
  - 2) *Discipleship/Teaching His word* Deut. 4:9; Prov. 27:17; Is. 50:4; Acts 2:40-47; 28:30-31; 1 Tim. 4:11-13; 2 Tim. 2:2; Titus 2:1-10.
  - 3) Knowledge of His word Ps. 119
  - 4) *Spiritual growth* Phil. 3:10; Col. 1:10; Heb. 5:12-6:8; 2 Peter 3:18.
  - 5) *Using the talents He gives* 1 Cor. 12; Eph. 4:7-16
  - 6) *Tithing/giving* Deut. 26:1-15; 2 Chron. 31; Neh. 10:28-39; Mal. 3:10; Heb. 7:5; Rom. 15:28; Phil. 4:17; Titus 3:14.
  - 7) **Worship** Heb. 13:15
- C. Acts of sincerity; the life we live Gal. 5:22-24
