"Who's Your King?"

<u>Intro.</u>

I. What/who is a king?

A. King – preeminence (Col. 1:18); chief authority

- B. So who/what has supreme authority & preeminence in your life? Who/what reigns supreme in your heart & mind?
 - Bitterness towards those who have wronged, hurt, attacked or slandered; towards those who disagree; towards those we love most: family & God.
 - 2) Arrogance/Pride I'm wrong...A LOT!!!
 - 3) Impatience/Intolerance lack of mercy, grace & forgiveness
 - 4) Entertainment sports; movies; television; internet
 - 5) Fear/doubt/worry/anxiety the future; things out of my control; hypotheticals
 - 6) People/relationships

<u>Body</u>

I. Ps. 145 – Who's your king?

- A. V.1 "*I will <u>extol</u>* (Heb. = to highly praise or exalt) *You, <u>my God</u>, <u>o</u> <u>King</u>..."*
 - We were born/created to worship the One worthy of all worship Is. 43:7, 21; Ps. 29:2, 10; 113:3; 148; 150; 1 Cor. 10:31; 1 Peter 2:9; Rev. 4:8-11.
 - 2) We will worship/praise whoever/whatever is king/god of our life; whatever is most important.
 - 3) When we don't worship the One true King, we replace that worship with something/someone else Jer. 2:9-13.
 - a) ***Who/what is king in your life today??? Who/what sits enthroned where only Jesus belongs? <u>Is God really King???</u>

- i) Perhaps some/most of the time; some/most areas, but not *ALL*.
- ii) Many have crowned a lot of things other than Jesus as king in their life & then justified it with acceptable Christian labels:
 - 1) Responsibilities = Family; work
 - R & R; "family time" = running ragged all week/ constant travels; staying up late on Fri. & Sat. & sleeping in on Sunday.
 - 3) Ministry when the purpose becomes greater than the Purpose Giver; when the conduit becomes more important than what it's carrying, then the focus has been lost from its Holy origin.
- b) What does God say about some of the things that we enthrone in our life?
 - i) Matt. 6:19-21, 24
 - ii) Luke 9:57-62; 12:15, 22-23; 14:25-27
 - iii) John 6:27; 1 John 2:15-17
 - *They're temporary & fleeting; hold limited importance & value; they're distracting & deceptive, never delivering the promises they present – Matt.
 4:1-11; Luke 4:1-13

II. What's the solution? How do we enthrone God as our King?

- A. V.1b 2 Develop a proper & eternal perspective.
 - 1) V.1 "I will bless Your name *forever and ever*"
 - V.2 "<u>Every day</u> I will bless You, and I will praise Your name <u>forever and ever</u>."
 - a) David enthroned God in his life by acknowledging & recognizing what was eternal & most important; what was worthwhile of his time & energy.

- b) David had committed to serving his King...in spite of his circumstances: forever and ever; every day = in the good times and bad!
- c) Major reason God isn't enthroned as King in our lives is b/c our worship is conditional/circumstantial Job 13:15; Ps. 23:4.
- B. V.3-5 Develop a proper understanding of God. How?
 - 1) <u>Praise Him</u> V.3 "Great is the Lord and greatly to be praised, and His greatness is <u>unsearchable</u>" (beyond our comprehension).
 - a) V.8-9 gracious; compassionate; patient; merciful & good.
 - b) V.10 All His works praise Him Ps. 19:1.
 - c) V.17 righteous & gracious
 - Our praise, like David's, needs to be in alignment with the One we are made to praise...if the Lord is great, then our praise should be great; if His greatness is beyond our ability to comprehend, then how much, how often & how fervently should we praise Him? If all of creation praises Him, why don't His people do the same???
 - Promote Him V.4 pass Jesus on to the next generation v.10-13; Is. 38:19; Deut. 6:1-9; 11:1-7, 18-23.
 - 3) <u>Ponder Him</u> V.5 "*I will meditate on the glorious splendor of Your majesty.*" (Phil. 4:8; Ps. 77:10-15)
 - a) <u>Meditate to set our minds on; to dwell on with intention</u>.
 - b) <u>Glorious completely wonderful.</u>
 - <u>Splendor</u> brilliantly gorgeous in appearance; great brightness or brilliant distinction.
 - d) <u>Majesty</u> supreme greatness; sovereignty; authority; royalty.
 - i) Discipline & train our minds & hearts to intentionally dwell on God's completely wonderful & brilliant brightness & supreme greatness & authority in spite of our circumstances or emotions.
