## **Titus 1:5-16**

#### "The Dirty Work"

## I. V.5 – Titus' calling (purpose)

- A. "For this reason I left you in Crete, that you should (1) set in order the things that are lacking and (2) appoint elders in every city as I commanded you."
  - 1) Set in order (Gr.) = to straighten out (medical term used in setting a crooked limb).
    - a) If a limb is crooked, that means it's broken! If something needs to be set in order that means it's out of order!
  - 2) Things that are lacking (Gr.) = absent (there's something that isn't there that needs to be).
    - a) Sometimes God calls us to difficult circumstances to set in order the things that are lacking...

### B. **Jeremiah 1:4-10**:

- 1) Root out & pull down to dig out & tear down
  - a) If you have to dig something out that means it's deeply rooted, which also means it's been there awhile & will take serious effort to remove.
  - b) If you have to tear something down that means someone else has taken the time to build it & won't be thrilled you're tearing it apart.
- 2) **Destroy & throw down** to bring to non-existence; to completely remove. To pull down or break into pieces.
  - a) If you have to annihilate something, that means there's no room or tolerance for its existence. <u>I.E. things in people's lives they deem as necessary or acceptable.</u>

- b) If you have to break something into pieces, the purpose is so that it can never be salvaged for future use.
- 3) **Build & to plant** to construct or rebuild. To establish for the future.
  - a) If you are called to rebuild, it means whatever was there prior was inadequate, so ensure to build properly.
  - b) If you're going to plant for the future, you have to commit to tending to the crop.

## II. What was lacking & needed to be set in order?

- A. V.5b proper leadership: "...appoint elders in every city..."
  - 1) Leadership positions are not designed to mature people; they're designed for the spiritually mature.
- B. V.10 Many:
  - 1) Insubordinate = unruly; rebellious v.15-16.
  - 2) <u>Idle talkers = empty; senseless v.14, 16.</u>
  - 3) Deceivers = mind deluders; seducers; misleading v.14.
  - 4) Especially those of the circumcision = legalism: Jews who taught salvation obtained through strict adherence to the law Acts 15:1-35; Rom. 2:26-29; 1 Cor. 7:17-24; Gal. 6:15; Col. 2:10-11; Deut. 10:12-17; Jer. 4:4; Eph. 2:8-9.
    - a) So according to Paul, there were a lot of unruly, rebellious, empty, senseless talking, mind deluding, seducing, misleading legalists...in the church!!!
    - b) How would you like that to be your job description???!!! But...
    - c) Why would Paul leave Titus there? B/c he had confidence in Titus that he was the one for the job!

d) Wherever you find yourself today, God has you there for a reason: he's given you your children for a reason; he's given you your neighbor for a reason; he's given you your boss/co-workers for a reason; he's given you your classmates for a reason; he led you from the south to Ct. for a reason!

#### III. V. 9-14 – The solution

- A. V.9 "Hold fast the faithful word... to exhort and convict those who contradict."
  - 1) Hold fast (Gr. = to cling tightly to) the faithful word b/c it's the word of God who cannot lie -v.2.
    - a) One reason many struggle with difficult assignments is we cling tightly to everything but the word of God: our flesh/natural tendencies; the world's logic/worldviews.
  - 2) Exhort = to call near; invoke
  - 3) Convict = to rebuke with truth
  - 4) Those who *contradict* (oppose) = we rebuke with truth those who oppose the truth v.14; John 8:45; Gal. 4:16; 2 Tim. 2:15-16, 23-26; 1 John 4:1-6.
- **B.** V.11 "Whose mouths <u>must</u> be stopped" = to put something over the mouth; i.e. to muzzle, <u>because</u>:
  - 1) "Who <u>subvert</u> (upset; overturn; overthrow) <u>whole</u> households, teaching things they ought not, for the sake of dishonest gain." –1 Cor. 15:33; Eph. 5:6; 2 Tim. 4:3-4; 2 Pet. 2:1-3; 1 John 2:26.
    - a) False teaching produces a profit when there are people who are willing to "buy" it, both literally & figuratively— 2 Cor.11:3-4; 2 Tim. 4:2-5.
      - i) V.15-16 When you reject the Gospel, nothing is valid (agnosticism). Your mind & conscience are corrupted along with your ability to discern right & wrong. *If your*

# mind is corrupt, it can't properly inform the conscience & in turn the conscience can't warn the individual.

- C. V.13 "Therefore, rebuke them sharply" = convict them severely; to cut abruptly.
  - 1) Convicting or cutting someone severely & abruptly is going to be painful; all discipline & correction always is Heb. 12:11.
    - a) A main reason things of this nature are allowed to exist in a church & the lives of believers is b/c the Biblical solution is deemed too harsh, painful or strict!
    - b) How would Timothy (or any pastor or Christian) go about severely convicting others about inappropriate & sinful conduct? V.9 "...holding fast the faithful word...by sound doctrine" Heb. 4:12; 2 Tim. 3:16; Rom. 15:4
  - 2) For what purpose?
    - a) "that they may be <u>sound</u> (healthy) in the faith." = the goal is to correct them; call them back to truth 2 Cor. 2:4; 7:8-16; Gal. 6:1.
    - b) V.14 "not giving heed to Jewish fables and commandments of men who turn from the truth." = so they don't get led astray with lies, slander & deception…both for the Cretans as well as mature Christians.
