2 Peter 1:1-11

"Problems & Attacks From Within"

I. 1:1-4 – The knowledge of God

- A. V.1 <u>Salvation</u> comes through a knowledge of God 1 Tim. 2:3-4.
 - 1) *Everyone's* salvation comes through God's righteousness, not man's Rom. 10:1-3. *Evidently, this was part of the false teaching Peter needed to address: salvation comes through no other means but Jesus Christ* Eph. 2:8-9; <u>Titus 3:4-7</u>.
- B. V.2 grace & peace come through a personal, intimate knowledge of God: Jesus Christ = explains the unrest & frustration in so many: they're trying to find peace through the means of this world which produces nothing but frustration John 14:27. The peace of God only comes through the grace of God Ps. 103:10; Rom. 5:1-2; Col. 1:19-22.
- C. V.3 <u>life & godliness</u> come through the <u>divine</u> (supreme; sacred) power of God & a knowledge of God's glorious nature: His glory & virtue Is. 55:6-9; Neh. 9:31.
- D. V.4 through this knowledge of God comes the <u>exceedingly great</u> (very great) and <u>precious</u> (valuable) promises (1 John 2:25), which provide the blessing of becoming a partaker of God's divine nature (1 John 3:1-3; 2 Cor. 5:21; 8:9) which delivers us from the bondage of sin & death Romans 6; 2 Cor. 3:17; Gal. 5:1 > Is. 61:1-3; John 8:36.

II. 1:5-11 – Our growth in God

- A. V.5 "<u>But also for this very reason</u>" = (v.1-4) being a willing and active recipient of God's saving grace & divine nature, we need to give <u>all **diligence**</u> (earnest zeal) to add/grow our spiritual walk:
 - 1) Add <u>virtue</u> (valor; excellence) to faith to ensure our faith is genuine 1 Pet. 1:6-7; James 1:2-8.
 - 2) Add knowledge to virtue often what we think isn't reality; i.e. we're not as righteous as we think we are; we don't know as much as we think we do Rom. 10:1-3; Mark 7:1-13; Gal. 1:13-14.

- a) "There can be no proper growth without a deepened understanding of spiritual realities." H.A. Ironside
- 3) Add self control to knowledge to avoid arrogance & sinful tendencies Rom. 12:1-3; 1 Cor. 8:1; 10:23-24; Phil. 2:3-4.
- 4) Add perseverance to self control to be consistently under control; not occasionally Ps. 39: <u>Prov. 16:32; 25:28; 29:11; Eccl. 5:2-3; 1 Cor. 9:25; James 1:19-20.</u>
- 5) Add Godliness to perseverance to ensure we're pressing on in the right things for the right reason with the right attitude 1 Tim. 4:7-8; 6:3-12.
- 6) Add <u>brotherly kindness</u> (fraternal affection) to Godliness the heart of Godliness is loving other people <u>1 John 4:7-11, 20-21</u>; John 13:34-35; 15:12.
- 7) Add <u>love</u> (agape) to brotherly kindness Christ like love loves all people at all times Rom. 5:6-8; 12:9; John 3:16; 1 John 3:16.
- B. V. 8 "For **if** <u>these</u> <u>things</u> (v.5-7) are yours and <u>abound</u> (increase; fill; superabound)" = re-emphasizing the importance of spiritual growth 2 Pet. 3:17-18; John 15:1-8; Heb.6:1-8.
 - 1) If we're growing as we should spiritually, we won't be <u>barren</u> (useless; yielding no return due to inactivity) or unfruitful in our spiritual walk. Our knowledge of God produces fruit for God.
 - a) How many Christian walks can be described as useless, unfruitful & yielding no return due to inactivity?
- C. V.9 when we lack "these things" (v.5-7), we're:
 - 1. Shortsighted (even blind) spiritually speaking = we're unable to see down the road b/c of spiritual immaturity/wrong focus; unable to discern spiritual things Col. 3:1-2.
 - a) As a result, we're blinded to the "freight trains" coming our way: deception; false doctrine; chameleon Christianity (blending in with the world); acceptable sinful lifestyles; watering down the word of God.

- 2. We develop spiritual amnesia: we forget we've been cleansed from our old sins = the worst consequence of a lack of growth: apathy & arrogance in our standing with God.
- D. V.10 therefore, be even more diligent to establish & strengthen your own salvation & spiritual growth, which enables us not to **stumble** (trip or err) = to be led astray or deceived.
- E. V.11 our reward for these things is eternal Col. 3:1-2.

III. V.12-15 – Persistence in our knowledge of God.

- A. V.12 "For this reason" (v.8-11 the results/consequences of not growing spiritually) Paul says he will not be **negligent** (careless not to care) to remind them always of the things he just mentioned, which are things they already know & are established in.
 - 1) Why would Paul be so concerned with telling them he is going to be diligent in telling them things they already know???
 - a) We're forgetful v.12, 13 &15; 3:1 = remind; John 14:26; Deut. 8:10-20; 31:20; 32:15-17; Jer. 2:32.
 - b) We need to be grounded in what we know Phil. 3:1; 1 Pet. 3:15; Col. 4:6; Prov. 15:28.
 - i) Don't practice until you get it right; practice until you can't get it wrong." Nick Saban
 - ii) Don't read & study Scripture until you understand it; read it and study it until you can't forget it Ps. 37:30-31; 119:11.
 - c) Focus & emphasize what's most important Gal. 4:18; 2 Tim. 4:1-5; John 21:15-23; Luke 22:32.
- B. V.13 Peter said as long as he was alive (in this tent), he understood it to be the right thing to do to keep stirring them up by reminding them.

- 1) Stir you up = to fully awaken; fan into flame; to shake back & forth.
 - a) How do you fan something into a flame???
 - i) Keep adding more fuel to the fire; i.e. God's word.
 - ii) Keep blowing on it; i.e. keep speaking God's truth into people's hearts & minds.
 - b) Extreme caution must be taken to ensure we're grounded & established in what we do know before moving onto "bigger & better" things spiritually speaking Heb. 5:12.
- C. V.14 15 Peter understood his time was running out here on earth & with it the opportunity to teach them the things they needed to be grounded in.
 - 1) To ensure the church was properly prepared corporately for the challenges to come, Peter began with a personal examination of their individual walk with Christ. If they weren't solid individually, they wouldn't be solid corporately. 1 Tim. 4:16.
 - 2) Peter committed himself to reminding them again and again of the things they already knew whether they wanted to hear it or not; whether they understood why he was doing it or not!
