## 2 Peter 3

#### "Peter's Farewell Address"

### I. V. 1-2 – Peter's final reminder

- A. V.1-2 *Another* (and final) reminder = same theme in both letters: Peter did not want them to forget!!! He reminded them of his reminders -1:12-14.
  - 1) V.1 Stir up = to fully awaken; fan into flame; to shake back & forth 1:13.
  - 2) V.1 Reminder = a recollection; a remembrance prompted by another.
  - 3) V.2 mindful = a fixture in the mind.
    - a) Peter wanted the church to be fully awakened by his constant reminders to have the words of God transfixed in their minds!
      - i) Unity & consistency = the Prophets, Apostles & Jesus all spoke the same thing & pointed to one event: the arrival/return of the Messiah!
      - ii) 66 books; over 40 authors covering a span of 1,500 years...AND NOT A SINGLE CONTRADICTION!!!

# II. V.3-7 – Peter's final warning

- A. V.3 "...knowing this first (most importantly)..."
  - 1) "Scoffers (Gr. = mocker or <u>derider</u>: to laugh at in scorn or contempt; to scoff or jeer at something serious) will come in the last days, walking according to their own lusts."
    - a) Scoffers identity tied to their lifestyle: they live how they choose, which is why they scoff at God's word 2 Peter 2:10; Rom. 1:18, 25, 28; Matt. 7:15-20.

- i) "If your lifestyle contradicts the Word of God, you must either change your lifestyle or change the Word of God." - Wiersbe
- *ii)* If you scoff at God's word, you will remove & distort the proper interpretation of God's word, so you can remove & distort the conviction of God's word, which then causes you to live without Biblical responsibility.
- 2) V.4 "And saying, 'Where is the promise of His coming?"
  - a) They challenge God's promise & word Gen. 3:1.
    - i) Scoffing at the word of God includes the promise of His return, b/c there is no accountability within that worldview 2 Cor. 5:10-11.
  - b) Their logic & reason = nothing has changed over time & it's taking too long = God isn't working according to their thoughts & timetable John 7:1-9; John 11; Is. 5:19; 55:8-9; 2 Pet. 3:15.
    - i) Gal. 4:4-5 In *God's* time, the Messiah was born, the Messiah was crucified and the Messiah will return Dan. 8:19.
- 3) V.5 "For this they willfully (intentionally) forget:
  - a) "...that by the word of God..." Ps. 29; 33:8-9; Heb. 11:3
    - i) It only serves to reason that if people will intentionally *distort* God's word, then they'll intentionally *ignore* God's word...even the Creator Himself Col. 1:16-17.
  - b) V. 5b "...by the word of God the heavens were of old...

    V.6 "...the world that then existed perished, being flooded with water."
  - c) V.7 the same Word that created, destroyed and now preserves everything that exists is the same Word that has condemned this

sinful world to destruction (v.10; Rev. 21:1) and **this** is what false teachers & scoffers will intentionally forget.

## III. V.8-18 – Peter's final encouragement & exhortation

- A. V.8 "Beloved (Christians), don't forget this one thing..."
  - 1) V.8 God is not confined by time Ps. 90:4; Is. 41:4; 43:13; 57:15; Dan. 7:9; Micah 5:2; John 8:58; Heb. 13:8; Rev. 1:8.
    - a) V.9 God keeps His promises Ps. 89:34; Is. 55:11; Mark 13:31.
    - b) V.10 God will return suddenly & forcefully Matt. 24:36-44; 1 Thess. 4:16; Rev. 19:11-16.
